Literacy

We are learning to...

- Fill in the missing words or phrase in a well known rhyme or story.
- Give meanings to marks we make.



Maths

We are learning to...

- Use some language of quantities such as 'more' and 'a lot'.
- Show an interest for shapes in the environment.
- Recite numbers in order.

Communication and Language

We are learning to...

- Show an understanding for 'who', 'what', 'where' in simple questions.
- Use talk to connect ideas and explain what is happening.
- Listen to others in conversations that interest us.
- Ask a variety of questions when things interest us.



Expressive Arts and Design.

We are learning to...

- Create sound by banging, tapping or shaking.
- Engage in imaginative role-play based on own experiences.
- Use a variety of construction materials.
- Imitate movement in response to music.



Learning Links

How to support your child's learning at home



- Ask your child about their session at Nursery. Talk about friends they have played with and activities they have enjoyed.
- Show your child how to use equipment such as scissors. Give them opportunities to have a go. Talk about the safety aspects of using scissors.
- Encourage your child to use their cutlery independently at meal times.
- Share stories with your child. Encourage them to focus their attention on the book as you read with them.
- Play different types of music at home. Create dance moves according to the music.
- Promote mark making by letting your child explore pens/pencils and paper at home.
- If possible allow them to use items such as cameras, remote controls or tablets (with adult supervision).
- Model language of size during conversations. Try to find things that are taller than them or smaller.
- Promote an interest in shapes by pointing out shapes in the environment.
- Go for walks to the local parks. Talk about the leaves falling from the trees. Let your child explore the outside environment.
- Talk about special friends. How we are kind to friends and use kind hands. Talk about happy feelings and sad feelings.
- Play turn taking games such as 'snap' and 'pairs'. Let your child experience winning as well as losing.
