Our strawberry plants are doing well too, and we are remembering to water them so they will continue to grow.


We all have new additions in our classrooms in the form of hungry caterpillars!

chrysalises and eventually turn into beautiful butterflies.


Year R even wrote their own versions of the story, 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar '

Hopefully on our trip to Burley we will get to see some in their natural habitat. We have also been learning to sew as we are making a mini beast or animal hand puppet. Some of them found it a bit tricky to thread the needle,

but they promised to keep practising!

In English, we have been using all our knowledge from the last year, to write an amazing story about something being stolen.

This is because we have read the books, 'Fantastic Mr Fox',

The Sound Collector by Roger McGough ressed all in black and grey ut every sound into a bo And carried it away

'The Tear Thief' and the poem 'The Sound Collector'.

All of these have things 'stolen' in them so the children wanted to write their own story about it.
