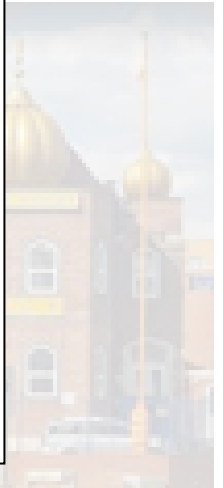

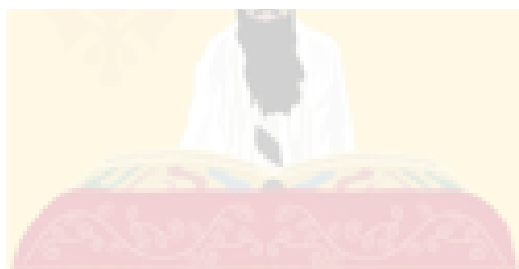

Autumn 1: Symbol

The children will be learning about how Christians and Sikhi faith use symbols.

Can you say what we will be learning about in our topic 'Pirates'?

By the end of this half term, children should know:

- what a harvest loaf is
- what a symbol is
- the importance of the harvest loaf to Christians
- the importance of the 5Ks to the Sikhi faith traditions
- how symbols relate to their own lives

Vocabulary:

Christians: a person who is a believer in Christianity

5Ks: the markers of the Sikhi faith

Harvest: process of gathering crops

Harvest loaf: decorative, large plaited loaf in the form of a wheat sheaf used in harvest celebrations

Importance: the fact of being of great significance or value

Khanda: an Indian sword and a symbol of the Sikhi faith

Sikhi faith: a person who follows the religion of Sikhism

Symbol: a mark, sign or word that indicates, signifies or is understood as representing an idea or object

Tradition: customs or beliefs from generation to generation



Autumn 2: Remembering

The children will be learning how Christians use Candlelight.

Can you say what we will be learning about in our topic
'Remember, Remember?'

By the end of this half term, children should know:

- what remembering means
- why Christians use an advent ring
- what an advent ring is
- what a Christingle represents to Christians
- the importance of remembering

Vocabulary:

Advent: the period before Christmas which celebrates the birth of Jesus

Advent ring: a ring made of evergreen plants and four candles around the edge and one in the middle

Christingle: a symbol to share the light of Jesus and spread the message of hope

Remembering: to bring to mind or think of again

Symbolism: the use of symbols to represent other ideas or qualities



Spring 1 : Change

The children will be learning about the People Jesus Met.
Can you say what we will be learning about in our topic 'Fire!
Fire!'?

By the end of this half term, children should know:

- how change affects their lives
- the story of Zacchaeus and its importance to Christians
- the story of The Blind Man and its importance to Christians
- why change is important to Christians

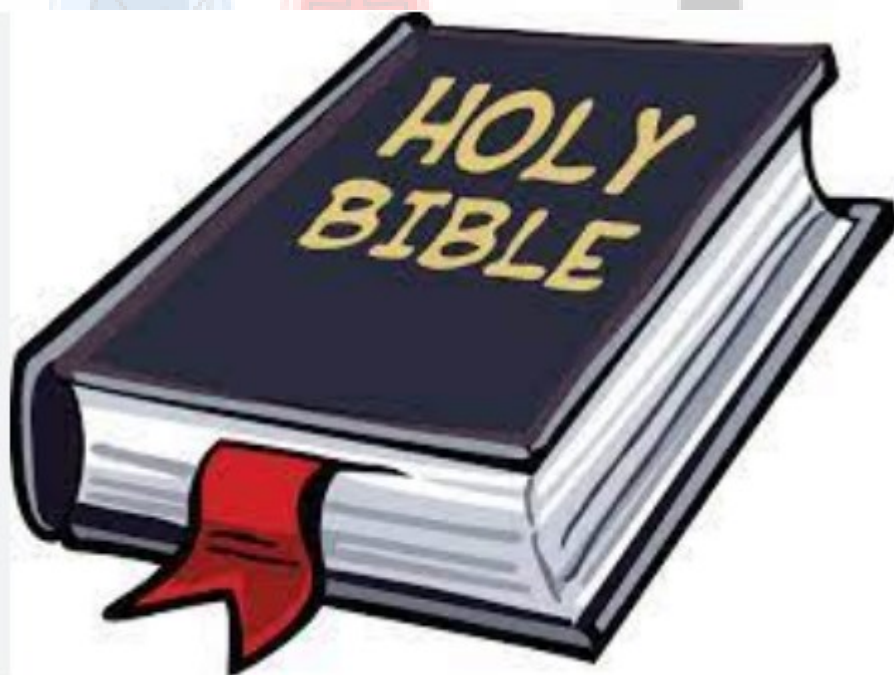
Vocabulary:

Change: replace with something else

Healer: a person that mends or repairs something

Bible: the Christian holy book (scriptures)

Miracles: a remarkable event or development that brings very welcome consequences



Spring 2: Love

The children will be learning about the Easter story and how love is used in Christianity.

Can you say what we will be learning about in our topic 'Unsinkable Journey'?

By the end of this half term, children should know:

- what the word love means to them
- what love might look like
- what Christians think love means
- the happy and sad parts of the Easter story
- the importance of the Easter story to Christians

Vocabulary:

Love: when you really care about someone or something

Sad: feeling unhappy

Happy: feeling positive about something

Easter: a Christian festival where Jesus died and rose again 3 days later.

Summer 1: Community

The children will be learning about the Sikhi faith and the importance they place on service (Sewa)

Can you say what we will be learning about in our topic 'Fantasy Creatures'?

By the end of this half term, children should know:

- the meaning of community
- the meaning and importance of Sewa to the Sikhi faith
- their place in different communities
- why people show generosity in their community

Vocabulary:

Community: a group of people who share the same interests or attitudes

Generosity: the quality of being kind and generous

Sewa: selfless service completed by people of Sikhi faith



Summer 2: Ritual

The children will be learning about ceremonies that take place in Christianity and Sikhi faith and the importance of these rituals.

Can you say what we will be learning about in our topic 'Mighty minibeasts and Healthy Humans'?

By the end of this half term, children should know:

- what happens in a Baptism ceremony
- what happens in an Amrit ceremony
- the importance of rituals to Christians and Sikhs
- their response to rituals

Vocabulary:

Amrit: syrup considered by Sikhs to be divine, and which they drink at religious observances including baptism.

Baptism: a ceremony where a person is welcomed into the Christian faith formally

Ceremony: a formal religious or public occasion, especially one celebrating a particular event, achievement, or anniversary.

Christening: a Christian ceremony at which a baby is christened

Ritual: a religious or solemn ceremony consisting of a series of actions performed according to a prescribed order.
