In areas where a dairy cow is not suitable, a local cow can be a blessing for a poor family. As well as reaping the benefits of manure on their crops, farmers can breed these African cows with high quality bulls to produce generations of excellent crossbreeds. Families can use the offspring to help plough their fields or sell them at market to generate income.

When a local cow is given, the first female calf is passed on to another needy family in the community and so the benefits of your gift continue on and on. This gift is given in Uganda.

The hens give eggs for food - a terrific source of protein and nourishment - and all the birds give droppings which can be used to make fantastic compost for crops. With the cockerel in the roost haby chicks are




Chickens are beneficial to every family, and are a particularly good option for orphans as they're easy to manage, need little space and their droppings make great compost. Chickens provide meat and up to 200 eggs a year – a vital source of protein and income.

Families also learn how to build the best chicken houses so that happy, safe chickens keep laying and their manure is easily collected. This gift is given in Ethiopia, Lesotho, Uganda and Kenya.

The UK government have pledged to match all donations with UK Aid which means we will be sending 2 dairy cows, 2 local cows, 34 chickens and 4 cockerels.
