We looked in books to find other examples of flowers growing and talked about seasonal changes. Celebrating World Book Day was lots of fun - we dressed up and invited our grown-ups in to share stories with us!

Year R

Year R has enjoyed the topic 'Once upon a time in a land far far away.' We have explored a range of traditional tales and had access to a variety of activities related with each tale. We have baked a Gingerbread man biscuit and decorated it using icing and raisins, but we have also enjoyed writing recipes and labelling the characters. We have also learnt about Story mountains and enjoyed creating our own. Story mountains help us structuring stories using pictures and words.
