

'Look what we've learnt..' Memos which tell you all about our weekly learning.


We would also love to see and celebrate what children are achieving outside of school, so please continue to upload observations on Tapestry.

made lists of all the things we could see or hear. We use our Phonics to help us with our writing. We are practising our handwriting by 'starting on the line' and are having a go at using neat



cursive. We completed a Science experiment using our sense of smell to vote for our favourite smells. The mint tooth paste was one of the favourite smells of the day! Admission to Infant School—Sept. 2022

If your child's birthday falls between 1 Sept. 2017—31 Aug. 2018 you will now need to apply for an Infant School place for your child for next Sept. 2022.

All applications should be made on-line via the 'Apply for a School Place' link on Southampton City Council's website.

Transfer to Junior School—Sept. 2022

If your child is currently attending one of our Year 2 classes you will now need to apply for a Junior School place for next September 2022.

Please apply on-line as above via the Southampton City Council website.

The Deadline for Both of the Above Applications MUST be Received by Southampton City Council by 23.59 on Saturday 15 January 2022.
